
I wish everyone a safe and enjoyable summer and we will see you at our events in the fall.

## FROM THE ARCHIVES

This month's topic, Pipe Organ Encounter, (POE) has been on my radar for quite some time. The Executive Board is in discussion and a working committee has been formed to discern hosting another POE in the next 2 plus years. Searching the Archives for background information I found a variety of programs that offered mentoring to young organists. My simple search netted me more information than I envisioned, so this article is Part 1 of 2 on Mentoring Young Organists.

### Part 1: Chapter's Mentoring of Young Organists

From the Chapter Yearbook 1983/84: a program held at Alverno College offered organ instruction under a program entitled "Young People's Arts Program." A pre-collegiate division existed under this program for high school students. The two instructors were two of our Chapter members of James Burmeister and Lee E. Erickson respectively. Courses and instruction for adults were also available as a non-credit basis through the umbrella of Continuing Education Division of Alverno College.

On November 5, 1995, under New Business, the topic of hosting a Pipe Organ Encounter, POE, was on the agenda. What started the discussion came in the form of a letter from Sr. Mary Jane Wagner requesting the Executive Board to consider hosting a POE during the summer of 1997. I spoke with Sr. Mary Jane, and she shared that "she had students who would benefit from the event" and felt strongly to request the board's input. The board was concerned about the amount of time and financial expenses that would be incurred to host such an event. A POE study Task Force was formed called the Pipe Organ Encounter Task Force, POETF. This task Force was to report back at the January 14, 1996, meeting, but it seems the committee needed more data gathering time and reported their findings at the March 10, 1996, meeting. As the POETK continued to discern hosting, they took it to the Chapter members by way of a POE survey which had favorable responses from 30 members. A motion was made for the POETF to continue to meet with the objective to complete the application for a POE no sooner that the summer of 1998. The motion was carried, and the Executive Board was greatly appreciative of the survey responses from members keeping their names on file for future use. There will be more on this program in Part 2.

Board minutes November 5, 1995, March 10, 1996, and PipeNotes January & June 1996

Seems there was to be a Student POE scheduled at the Uihlein Hall on November 27, 1997, with the Miller organ but my Archive sources say the event was cancelled. From the board meeting minutes of January 19, 1998, there is mention of rescheduling the Student POE with the Miller Organ in Uihlein Hall. Will have to do a deeper search to find if this event was rescheduled for inclusion in Part 2. However, "Organist for a Day" was introduced in December 1997. Could this event be the rescheduled Student POE? Sub-Dean Scott Eakins shared in PipeNotes this program is an opportunity to assist and introduce the pipe organ to 12–18-year-old piano students and their teachers. The mechanics of the instrument, technique, registration and actual "time for students to let their hands and feet experience the instrument" was part of the day "with the help from a mentor from the Guild." The Guild looked to all the members to promote and assist to have a successful event. Several members stayed after the board meeting on February 1, 1998, to view "Close Encounters" a video produced by National Headquarters about the pipe organ and POE opportunities. A decision was made after viewing the video that it should be included during the upcoming "Organist for a Day" event. The schedule of events was set for Saturday, February 21, 1998, at St. Matthew's Lutheran Church in Wauwatosa. Guild members Marilyn Stulken and David Beyer did presentations of Technique/Registration and Mechanical Action of the Pipe Organ respectfully. The attendees got to take part in an Organ Crawl to Grace Lutheran Church in downtown Milwaukee and then took a ride to Mequon to Concordia University to Chapel of Christ Triumphant. The day kept pace with dinner on campus of Concordia and then an evening recital by Erik Suter. Mr. Suter, an accomplished young organist, studied with Thomas Murray at Yale University and was first place winner in the Conrad Sulzer Young Performer's Piano Competition in 1991 and first prize winner in 1993 of the Chicago American Guild of Organists Young Organist's Competition. His musical genius continued with first prize in 1995 at the National Undergraduate Organ Competition in Ottumwa Iowa and International Organ Competition in Musashino Tokyo in Japan in 1996. Back at his Alma Mater he won first prize in 1997 at Yale's Biennial Organ Competition. What a wonderful inspiration for these young organists attending

this event. The Guild worked on advertising "to get the word out" for this event by sending out 1700 brochures to area Guild members, churches, synagogues, interested individuals and piano teachers. Board minutes February 1, 1998, and PipeNotes January and February 1998

On Saturday, March 6, 1999, at 10 am a master class was scheduled with Alan Morrison at Christ Church in Whitefish Bay. Registration was open to students aged 12 to adult. Reported in the March 7 Board meeting minutes by J. Doenges, there were three students who played for Alan Morrison with ten attendees for his master class.

Chapter Yearbook 1998/1999 and PipeNotes May & June 1999

In 2010 the chapter hosted a week-long POE at Carroll University in Waukesha. This will be the focus of my Part 2 in the fall. Before I wrap up this article, I want to share a personal testimony from Chapter member Keri Kelly on her experience attending POEs.

### Keri wrote:

"Pipe organ was not my first instrument, but when my church needed an organist for Mass, I knew I'd like to do it since I played piano and I thought the transition wouldn't be difficult.

I looked around online for summer camps that would help me learn more about the organ, and I came across the POE that was being held in Manhattan, Kansas in 2021. I eagerly signed up to attend, even though I never heard of 'the American Guild of Organists.'

While attending this POE, I learned so much from the teachers and from the other participants. It was so fun to see other young people interested in pipe organ, and the teachers were all so inspiring. We got to visit some fantastic organs, as well as playing a recital for our friends and family at the end of the week. I had the same experiences at the other POE I attended in Hartford, CT last year.

I believe that these outreach 'programs' by the AGO are extremely important because it helps young musicians connect with and meet other young people and teachers. I made some of my best friends at the POEs, and I still keep in contact with my teachers I met while attending. I don't think I'd be the musician I am today if I didn't attend the POEs."




us to remain healthy, collegial, and active regarding promotion of our work and art."
