An open house to celebrate Marilyn K. Stulken, organist for St. Luke's Episcopal Church, was held on Sunday, October 2nd at the DeKoven Center. Stulken is lauded as distinguished hymnologist, teacher and organist. Marilyn began her studies in church music and organ at Hastings College in Hastings, NE. She earned her BA degree in 1963 and continued with graduate study at Eastman School of Music in Rochester NY (MM 1967 and DMA 1975). She has taught at Coe College—Cedar Rapids IA, University of Iowa—Iowa City IA, University of Wisconsin-Parkside—Kenosha WI and Concordia University—Mequon WI. She has been organist at St. Luke's Episcopal Church—Racine WI for the past 29 years. She has also served congregations in Nebraska, New York and Iowa.

Marilyn is the author of Hymnal Companion to the Lutheran Book of Worship, With One Voice-Reference Companion, A Handbook to the Service-Book and Hymnal of the Lutheran Church and Indexes for Worship-Planning, Hymns of Comfort, Scandinavian and Finnish Hymnody in America and Introduction Tool, Repertoire and Registration for the Small Organ. She is co-author of Amazing Grace Hymn Text Devotional Use and Hymnal Companion to Worship—3rd Edition and her articles, columns and reviews number well over 100. Marilyn is well-known in church music circles.


