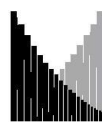

On Monday, July 19th, the physical archive for our AGO Milwaukee Chapter was officially transferred to the Wisconsin Historical Society. Jonathan Nelson, Collection Development Archivist; Quinn Olson, CH Coakley representative; and I met at CH Coakley's Wauwatosa facility at 1400 N. 113th Street. Two very large plastic tubs of binders were carefully and orderly reassembled into boxes that were then loaded into a van and sent with Jonathan Nelson back to Madison to be formally catalogued. After this process is complete, the archive will be permanently housed at UW-Milwaukee. According to Jonathan Nelson, Wisconsin is the only state that houses collections in their original locality. It is nice to know that should you desire to see actual print copies of certain programs or convention books; you will be able to access them here in Milwaukee where our organization resides. We also received a wonderful historic tour through pictures of CH Coakley given by Beth Coakley, Human Resources Manager. Beth is a descendant of the founder of CH Coakley and described their history, locations, and the company's business.

We continue to work on access to the digital archive, which is currently residing on our website, but is not yet accessible to members. The goal is still to have this access for members ready in the fall. Liz Walloch is preparing ideas for our membership to interact with and explore the online archive. It will be a wonderful way to honor our history, understand where we have been, and inform our future! Liz says, and I concur, that we need to celebrate this milestone in our chapter's history. More to come!

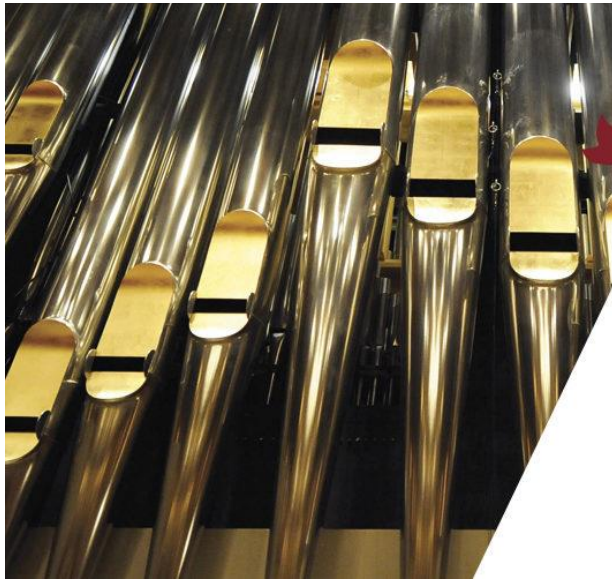
